Canberra residents and visitors can find out how to make their home more energy efficient this winter by taking a guided tour of the new Energy Efficient Demonstration Home in Strathnairn at Ginninderry.

The home's owner and Director of Commonsense Sustainability Solutions, Mr Paul Nagle, said he's opening his home up to visitors to share tips and tricks about how you too can conserve energy throughout the year and save money on your power bills.

"The purpose of this build was to provide an educational resource, which shows visitors firsthand how they can easily achieve energy efficient, sustainable solutions in their own homes."

The Ginninderry Sustainable Home was officially opened on Sunday 7 August by the ACT Minister for Housing and Suburban Development, Yvette Berry; the Minister for Climate Change and Sustainability, Shane Rattenbury; the Minister for the Environment and Sustainable Building and Construction, Rebecca Vassarotti; and Federal Senator for the ACT, David Pocock.
